

Head's Line:

Dear Hollyfield Community,

Welcome back to another school year. Ms Jackson is currently at an Ofsted Conference today. Therefore, I have the pleasure of editing the ebulletin this week.

Like many of you, I'm sure, we were saddened by the announcement of the death of Queen Elizabeth II. I spent Thursday evening listening to the radio and watching the television coverage of her reign. The key theme was the extraordinary dedication and service she gave to our nation. For over 70 years, she has been a constant and steadying presence in the background of millions of lives within the UK and across the Commonwealth. She embodied the values of decency and tolerance, encouraging people to be the best they could. These are all values we try to uphold and instil in our students.

As a school and a nation, it is important that we recognise the death of the Queen and celebrate her life. On Thursday, the premises team put the union jack up at half-mast. This will stay up for the period of mourning. During registration on Friday, the form tutors delivered a special presentation put together by Mr Buckman which explained what we could learn from the Queen's life. According to the DfE, the school will remain open during this period of national mourning. There will be a further announcement next week regarding the funeral. Once we have received this, we will communicate this to our school community.

On another note, the start of the term has been extremely positive. We were delighted to welcome our new Year 7 students on Tuesday. The students had the opportunity to get to know the school and their form tutors without all of the other students here. Mr Blakley and the Year 7 team are working extremely hard to ensure all our Year 7 students settle in as quickly as possible. If your son/daughter is finding the transition difficult, please contact the Year 7 team and we will support them.

Our other year groups have started the year in a calm and focused manner. Our new Year 10 students have started their GCSE courses and Year 11 are already focused on the year ahead. Years 8 and 9 have new Heads of Year, working tirelessly to get to know their year group and students. The relationship building which is happening will ensure that your son/daughter is fully supported during this academic year.

We will be holding our annual Parents' Information Evenings over the coming weeks, these have proved very useful and are a vital part of the school's communication with parents and so we request that you attend these sessions to ensure you are fully informed.

Water Bottles

Please ensure your child brings a water bottle with them to school every day, it is even more important during hot weather. Our water fountains can be used to refill bottles as necessary during break and lunch, it is not possible to drink from the fountains direct and we do not have bottles or cups to give out to students. Alternatively, bottles of water can be purchased (and refilled) in the cafeteria, please ensure your Parentmail account has enough funds to enable this.

Surbiton Hill Road Entrance for cars

If you drive/collect students to or from school the visitor's car park/Surbiton Hill Road entrance <u>should not be used to drop</u> <u>off students</u>. This causes congestion for people entering the site and staff access, cars travelling on Surbiton Hill Road and is potentially dangerous for pedestrians.

Dinner Money Top Up

Please ensure funds are available 24 hours before they are required when topping up your child's dinner money on Parentmail. If you add funds on the day they are to be used we will not be able to see the credit instantly until the system has processed it, therefore creating a delay in your child buying food at the canteen.

Careers Briefing - 9 September 2022 by Mr Poole & Miss Corrighan (Careers team)

As a new term begins and students begin the next stage of their education, the careers team is working hard to create opportunities for students to begin to discuss and plan for their future choices. One aspect of high-quality career education is for "every student to have learned from employers about work, employment and the skills that are valued in the workplace."

As part of achieving this aim, the school has been working with Speakers for Schools, which is an educational charity, which gives state schools access to key speakers who are leading professionals, academics and experts in their field. As a result, Lara Morgan, a successful entrepreneur and business leader will be talking to Year 11 on September 20 about her career journey and what qualities she needed to succeed. Hopefully, many of the Year 11s will be inspired to hear her story and will be motivated to face the challenges ahead.

Future Choices Careers Fair Thursday October 13 6.30-8.30pm

Also, as part of the programme for this term, there will be a Careers Fair on Thursday October 13 between 6.30-8.30pm. Students from Year 11,12 and 13 will be encouraged to attend. Parents can attend as well! This event was run very successfully last year as a large number of employers and employees from business and industry attended as well as representatives from several colleges and universities. We are aiming to run the careers fair again this year with even more guests from the world of work.

The aim of the evening is to stimulate a broad discussion about future career choices and for students to find out more about the realities of the workplace.

- Year 11 should be beginning to think about A level, BTEC, T Level or apprenticeship choices.
- Year 12 should be considering broadening and developing their skills and knowledge and also looking for contacts for relevant and meaningful work experience. The Careers Fair could provide an ideal time to start networking.



• Year 13 of course are in their final year and considering whether to go to university or go out to work and perhaps study for a higher or degree apprenticeship. Therefore, a visit to the careers fair might be a useful experience and there will be plenty of employers, undergraduates and graduates who can advise them.

Last year was also a very successful event due to the very strong support from parents from all year groups who volunteered and if you attended last year as a volunteer it would be great to welcome you back again. We would also welcome new volunteers and any experienced alumni who feel they could provide inspiration and advice to our students.
