

All new Year 7 parents have been sent a link to enable them to register for Parentmail. Please can we ask all parents to do this, Parentmail is our main facility for communication with you and we cannot stress enough the importance of this. We are endeavouring to use less paper communication and will rely on Parentmail to replace paper copies. Parentmail is also used to pay for all school events and meals.

Water Bottles

Please ensure your child brings a water bottle with them to school every day, it is even more important during hot weather. Our water fountains can be used to refill bottles as necessary during break and lunch, it is not possible to drink from the fountains direct and we do not have bottles or cups to give out to students. Alternatively, bottles of water can be purchased (and refilled) in the cafeteria, please ensure your Parentmail account has enough funds to enable this.

Surbiton Hill Road Entrance for cars

If you drive/collect students to or from school the visitor's car park/Surbiton Hill Road entrance <u>should not be used to drop</u> <u>off students</u>. This causes congestion for people entering the site and staff access, cars travelling on Surbiton Hill Road and is potentially dangerous for pedestrians.

Dinner Money Top Up

Please ensure funds are available 24 hours before they are required when topping up your child's dinner money on Parentmail. If you add funds on the day they are to be used we will not be able to see the credit instantly until the system has processed it, therefore creating a delay in your child buying food at the canteen.

ACHIEVEMENT POINTS

Achievement and behaviour points are awarded every day at Hollyfield in line with our school policy and are a fundamental part of school life. Just under 2 weeks until the careers fair. This event is designed for all students in **Year 11 and the Sixth** Form. Year 10 students and parents have also asked whether they can attend and whilst it is not compulsory any students from this year group would be welcome!

For Year 11 students this will be a good opportunity to talk through your future plans for next year with a variety of people. For those students in the Sixth Form this careers fair is even more relevant as you can meet employers; representatives for colleges and universities who will be able to advise you on your next steps and hopefully in some cases provide you with useful links for potential work experience. Year 12 will be going out on work experience in the summer and Year 13 will either be going to university or out to work. Any opportunity to talk about future career choices is important at this stage.
