#### Head's Line:

Dear Hollyfield Community,

I hope you are all well and have enjoyed your week. I will begin with a few reminders: on Thursday 17 November we have our sixth form open evening. This is a great opportunity for Year 11 students and their parents to come along and see the sixth form, but to also hear from the sixth form team and talk to teachers about the different subjects we have on offer. The evening begins at 6.00pm and finishes at 8.00pm. I look forward to seeing you all there. In order to prepare for the event, the school will be closing to all students at the end of period 4 (12:40pm) and will reopen as normal on Friday morning.

In addition to the sixth form open evening, we also have a number of other events next week. Our Year 11 students will be sitting their mock MFL speaking exams as we begin our mock exam timetable, our A level biology students will be attending a biology conference, and some of our Year 10 students will be taking part in a Jack Petchey workshop on public speaking. Well done to all of those involved.

As parents will know, before half term we launched our offer of residential trips. We have offered all students in Year 7 – Year 10 the opportunity to attend a residential this year and the trips have proven to be very popular. In addition to this, we have launched our ski trips which will run in February 2024. Our original offer was for students in Year 7 and Year 8 to go skiing in Europe and for those in Year 9 – Year 12 to go skiing in Canada.

Thanks to the parents of older students who have written to me to ask if we could explore the options of a European trip for the older year groups as well, to reduce the environment impact and cost.

With that in mind, I'm very happy to explore alternative options which may enable more students to participate in the trip. I cannot guarantee that I will be able to make these work, but I will work alongside the travel company over the next week and write to parents with news of any updated offers by the end of November. I appreciate that there may be parents reading this who have booked a place on the Canada trip for their child. At this stage, we still plan for this trip to go ahead, we are simply looking at alternatives as well. Thank you in advance for your patience.

### Year 7 Parents - Parentmail - Please register now

All new Year 7 parents have been sent a link to enable them to register for Parentmail. Please can we ask all parents to do this, Parentmail is our main facility for communication with you and we cannot stress enough the importance of this. We are endeavouring to use less paper communication and will rely on Parentmail to replace paper copies. Parentmail is also used to pay for all school events and meals.

### Changed your address/email/phone number????

If you have changed your contact details, please email the school office on <u>office@hollyfield.kingston.sch.uk</u> stating your child's name and form and the change of details. It is important to keep these details up to date in case of an emergency. Don't forget to update your Parentmail account with your new details.

### **Water Bottles**

Please ensure your child brings a water bottle with them to school every day, it is even more important during hot weather. Our water fountains can be used to refill bottles as necessary during break and lunch, it is not possible to drink from the fountains direct and we do not have bottles or cups to give out to students. Alternatively, bottles of water can be purchased (and refilled) in the cafeteria, please ensure your Parentmail account has enough funds to enable this.

### Surbiton Hill Road Entrance for cars

If you drive/collect students to or from school the visitor's car park/Surbiton Hill Road entrance <u>should not be used to drop off students</u>. This causes congestion for people entering the site and staff access, cars travelling on Surbiton Hill Road and is potentially dangerous for pedestrians.

### **Dinner Money Top Up**

Please ensure funds are available 24 hours before they are required when topping up your child's dinner money on Parentmail. If you add funds on the day they are to be used we will not be able to see the credit instantly until the system has processed it, therefore creating a delay in your child buying food at the canteen.


The Single Point of Access is a multi-agency team, managed by our local authority, Achieving for Children. They work closely with a wide range of teams and partner agencies and facilitate different levels of support depending on the needs of the child. These agencies may include education, health, youth support and services, police and the range of support that is on offer includes:

- Access to Early Help Services including Family Support
- Providing advice regarding further referrals such as to Children and Adult Mental Health Services
- Making referrals to Children's Social Care Services to access social care.
- Help with school attendance through the Education Welfare Services (EWO).


In school we have a responsibility to contact SPA when a child discloses a concern to us, from our experience the social care team are very supportive and work to help families through challenging situations.




## TOP ATTENDERS



# Family **Transitions** Triple P

Family Transitions Triple P is designed for parents experiencing personal distress from separation or divorce, which is impacting on or complicating their parenting. It consists of five group sessions.

Session 1: Divorce - a family transition

Session 2: Coping with emotions (1)

Session 3: Coping with emotions (2)

Session 4: Managing conflict

Session 5: Balancing work, family and play Family Transitions Triple P helps parents who need extra support

to adjust and manage the transition from a two-parent family to a single-parent family. It focuses on skills to resolve conflicts with former partners and how to cope positively with stress

Who is it for? Parents who benefit from this program are those who have or are going through separation and divorce where there are unresolved conflicts and difficulties communicating effectively with former partners.

Parents may be concerned that the separation or divorce is upsetting the children or they may want to learn ways to talk to their children about it and teach them ways to cope. Parents who do this course usually have concurrent concerns about their child's behaviour.

# Venetian Vespers for the Ascension

The Feast of the Ascension (Fēsta de la Sēnsa) was, and remains, a major public celebration of Venice's glory. It culminates in the renewal of the ritual marriage between the city and the sea, as a symbolic gold ring is thrown into the lagoon. This mouth-watering fantacy! Vespers, devised by Andrew Griffiths, brings together music from Monteverdi's later publications with sumptuous motets – including by Giovanni Gabrieli, Andrea Gabrieli and Giovanni Croce – reflecting both the religious and political pomp of this lavish festival.

Kingston Choral Society recently celebrated its 250th concert with a performance of Handel's Messiah, the work with which the Society was launched in 1950. It has developed a strong reputation both for high standards and adventurous programming, mixing familiar classics with lesser-known gems; recent performances include Bach's St John Passion and B Minor Mass, Haydn's Creation and Verdi's Requiem at Cadogan Hall, Howells' Hymnus Paradisi, Jonathan Dove's Missa Brevis, Dyson's Sweet Thames, Run Softly, Stanford's Elegisc Ode, and the world première of Graham Ross' And since to bok at things in Bloom.
