Flu Vaccination

This vaccination is recommended to help protect your child against flu and is offered to years 7 through to 9. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and can cause serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable family and friends by preventing the spread of flu. There may be a rebound in flu levels this coming winter following low levels in the past 2 years as a result of COVID-19 restrictions.

Please can we remind all parents to complete a MHCP for any student with a medical condition if you have not already done so. Also, if there are any changes to a current plan please complete and submit a new MHCP so we can update our records. You can [print a form](#) and return it to school.

Year 7 Parents – Parentmail – Please register now

All new Year 7 parents have been sent a link to enable them to register for Parentmail. Please can we ask all parents to do this, Parentmail is our main facility for communication with you and we cannot stress enough the importance of this. We are endeavouring to use less paper communication and will rely on Parentmail to replace paper copies. Parentmail is also used to pay for all school events and meals.

Changed your address/email/phone number????

If you have changed your contact details, please email the school office on office@hollyfield.kingston.sch.uk stating your child's name and form and the change of details. It is important to keep these details up to date in case of an emergency. Don't forget to update your Parentmail account with your new details.

Water Bottles

Please ensure your child brings a water bottle with them to school every day, it is even more important during hot weather. Our water fountains can be used to refill bottles as necessary during break and lunch, it is not possible to drink from the fountains direct and we do not have bottles or cups to give out to students. Alternatively, bottles of water can be purchased (and refilled) in the cafeteria, please ensure your Parentmail account has enough funds to enable this.

Surbiton Hill Road Entrance for cars

If you drive/collect students to or from school the visitor's car park/Surbiton Hill Road entrance **should not be used to drop off students**. This causes congestion for people entering the site and staff access, cars travelling on Surbiton Hill Road and is potentially dangerous for pedestrians.

Dinner Money Top Up

Please ensure funds are available 24 hours before they are required when topping up your child's dinner money on Parentmail. If you add funds on the day they are to be used we will not be able to see the credit instantly until the system has processed it, therefore creating a delay in your child buying food at the canteen.

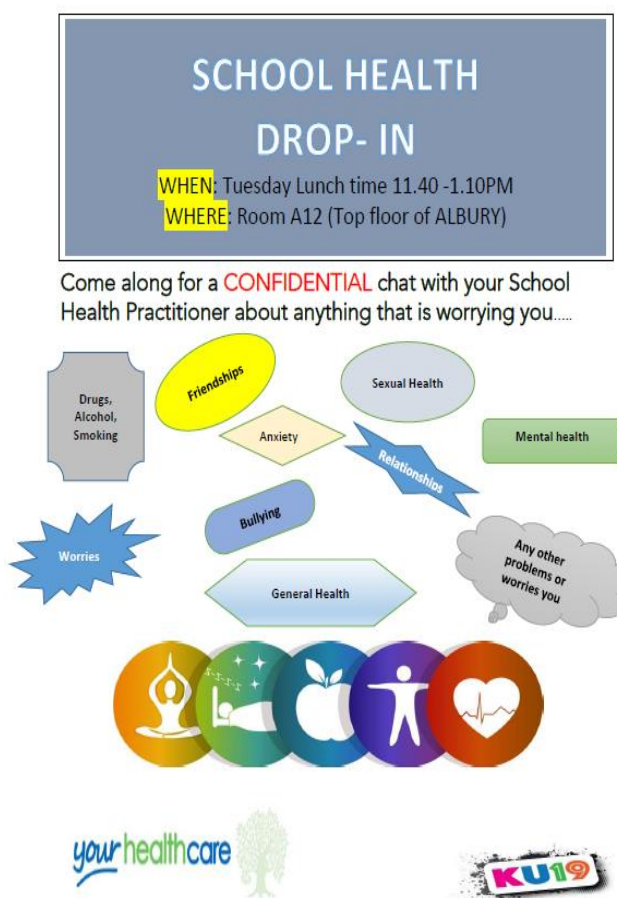

MISS O'SHEA'S TEACHING & LEARNING UPDATE

No Pens Day

This week Key Stage 3 had a series of lessons where a pen was a banned item. The concept of No Pens Day is one in which oracy and the art of conversation, discussion and listening are celebrated and explored through a range of activities planned and delivered by our committed team of teachers.

Here are some snapshots:

English

Year 9 - Linking with our study and exploration of key themes in 'To Kill a Mockingbird,' we completed a controversial Diamond Nine, ranking activity, where we respectfully discussed the American judicial

system, gun laws and Constitutional Rights versus Human Rights. Not once did we lift a pen, but instead listened and reacted to ideas and questions raised.

Year 7 - To enhance our current learning, Year 7s entered into a philosophical discussion about life after death, extending each other's ideas and challenging their positions, while listening attentively. We then connected this to the Ancient Greek concept of The Underworld. Students were allocated parts to play which allowed them to express themselves through their expressions, movement and tone of voice. The lesson came to a dramatic climax when three judges decided on the fate of a 'dead soul' - Elysium, Astrophel Fields or Tartarus?

Modern Foreign Languages

For the jobs guess who Year 9 students had to ask yes or no questions in Spanish to try and work out the person's job (one student at the front had chosen a job and was answering the questions).

The Monkey game was a particular favourite across Key Stage 3 - in teams students choose a square and are asked a question, if they get it right, they win whatever points are under the square. Some squares have arrows or monkey faces under them, arrows mean the teams swap points, monkeys make them lose all of their points - there were some very competitive classes yesterday!

How to play Monkey Game: Split the class into 2 teams, then ask each team in turn for vocab or phrase retrieval. If they respond correctly they can choose a square on the Monkey Game board, but they won't necessarily win points for their team - if the number reveals a monkey face, they lose all points for their team.
