Head's Line:

Dear Hollyfield Community,

On behalf of the staff and governors, I would like to wish the whole community a very happy new year. This half term is a very short half term, comprising only five and a half weeks and we are a week in already. For many of our students, the time frame won't feel too significant, but for those in Year 9, Year 11 and Year 13, it certainly will. For our Year 9 students, this half term marks the start of their options process. This is where students can make decisions about the GCSEs they would like to study in Year 10. It is extremely exciting as there are many wonderful courses on offer, but it can also feel a little overwhelming for students. We mitigate this by ensuring that all students are given the opportunity to talk through their options with a senior member of staff. Mr Kynes has written to parents of Year 9 students with full details of the options process. The first significant date is the Year 9 parents evening next Thursday (12/1/23). I have included a link to his letter [here](#) for your reference.

Our Year 11 and Year 13 students will certainly be feeling a sense of excitement as they come to the end of the taught content for their GCSE and A level subjects. Both year groups have recently completed their mock exams and both year groups have upcoming parents' evenings: Year 11 on 19/1/23 and Year 13 on 8/2/23 (please note this is a Wednesday). Parents' evenings will give teachers an opportunity to discuss how best you can support your child in their exam preparations and what they can do to achieve as highly as possible. As with last year, all parents' evenings will be in person events. Appointments can be booked using school cloud. Mr Bonehill has written to Year 9 and Year 11 parents with reminders on how to do this. If anyone needs any further support in setting up or utilising the school cloud booking system then please do just call the office and they will be happy to help. The booking for sixth form parents' evening will open later this month, Mr Bonehill and Mr Warren will write to all parents of students in the sixth form with reminders on how to book appointments in due course.

Our Year 12 students begin their internal exam week next week. Students will be on study leave for this, only needing to come in for their exams. This is with the exception of BTEC lessons, which will run as normal. We wish the Year 12 students every success in these exams.

Parents will be aware of the number of coughs, colds and other illnesses present within the community. Public Health Kingston have asked all schools to share the following message with their community:

It is important to minimise the spread of infection in schools and other education and childcare settings as much as possible so parents should be advised that if their child is unwell and has a fever, they should stay home from school or nursery until they feel better and the fever has gone. [Is my child too ill for school? - NHS](#)

Parents can also support in helping children to learn about the importance of good hand hygiene with regular hand washing at home with soap and warm water, and encouraging catching coughs and sneezes in tissues then binning them and washing hands, which is another simple way to help stop illness from spreading.

Flu vaccination uptake among young children remains low. Flu can be very unpleasant and in some cases can lead to more serious illness. Getting your child vaccinated protects them, and others they come into contact with.

And finally, please can I ask all parents to remind their children of the need to stay safe on the way to and from school. Although the hours of daylight are slowly increasing, it is still dark until 0800 and then getting dark again before 1630. This makes it harder for drivers to see pedestrians and so the need to remain on the pavement, cross at allocated crossings and to

Valuable in school

The school policy and guidance with regard to pupil possessions is clear that they are brought into school at their own risk. The Hollyfield School does not accept liability for any items that may be lost, damaged or stolen. While theft is taken extremely seriously and thoroughly investigated, the school is not in a position to cover the cost of any item stolen.

Of course, with respect to the last point, steps and measures are put in place to mitigate against such circumstances, especially during PE and Games lessons, where pupils' items are locked in the changing rooms. While this is standard procedure, there may be some extenuating circumstances where this cannot always be guaranteed. Therefore, I would urge your son/daughter not to bring expensive items into school.

Medical Health Care Plans

Please can we remind all parents to complete a MHCP for any student with a medical condition if you have not already done so. Also, if there are any changes to a current plan please complete and submit a new MHCP so we can update our records. You can [print a form](#) and return it to school.

Changed your address/email/phone number????

If you have changed your contact details, please email the school office on office@hollyfield.kingston.sch.uk stating your child's name and form and the change of details. It is important to keep these details up to date in case of an emergency. Don't forget to update your Parentmail account with your new details.

Water Bottles

Please ensure your child brings a water bottle with them to school every day, it is even more important during hot weather. Our water fountains can be used to refill bottles as necessary during break and lunch, it is not possible to drink from the fountains direct and we do not have bottles or cups to give out to students. Alternatively, bottles of water can be purchased (and refilled) in the cafeteria, please ensure your Parentmail account has enough funds to enable this.

Surbiton Hill Road Entrance for cars

If you drive/collect students to or from school the visitor's car park/Surbiton Hill Road entrance **should not be used to drop off students**. This causes congestion for people entering the site and staff access, cars travelling on Surbiton Hill Road and is potentially dangerous for pedestrians.

Dinner Money Top Up

Please ensure funds are available 24 hours before they are required when topping up your child's dinner money on Parentmail. If you add funds on the day they are to be used we will not be able to see the credit instantly until the system has processed it, therefore creating a delay in your child buying food at the canteen.

Careers Briefing - January 6 2023

At the beginning of 2023 there is plenty for students to focus on in the coming months.

For those students in **Year 9** they will need to think about their Key stage 4 options choices and this provides them with the perfect opportunity to start considering future career pathways. Mr Kynes will be talking to the year group in assembly and at the end of January the options booklets will be sent out on parentmail. In the meantime, students will be receiving advice and guidance from the careers team and their teachers.

For **Year 11** this is the final term of study before they start their GCSES and BTEC exams in the summer. Most students in Year 11 will have had at least one careers interview by now and decided whether they want to stay on at Hollyfield Sixth Form or study at another Sixth Form or College or go out to work and do an apprenticeship. There is plenty of advice available both in school and online and if any students still need help they can talk to a careers adviser. Mr Poole is in Hollyfield Monday to Wednesday and Ms Corrighan is in school on Thursday. Students can make an appointment through their tutor and see Mr. Poole or Ms Corrighan to book a time.

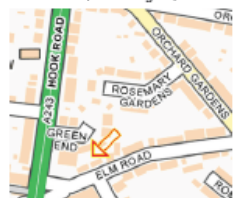
