Head's Line:

Dear Hollyfield Community

I hope this message finds you well, and that you didn't get too drenched in the downpours today. Our students have been working very hard and taking part in some special events this week. We hosted mental health awareness workshop for students in Years 8 and 9, which was led by an external speaker who had presented to staff earlier in the academic year. Thanks to Mrs McGeogh for setting this up and to all the staff who supported the event. It was a very important and impactful session.

Hollyfield is part of the ISSP, which is an Independent State School Partnership with several local schools. Also this week four of our top Year 10 mathematicians joined 20 other schools for #MathsFeast at Raynes Park High School, Ady, Issy, Wojciech and Adam spent the afternoon problem solving as a team to try to beat other schools in the area, including Tiffin Girls and Kingston academy. The competition was tough, with the team working really well together. Well done to everyone.

Next week, students will take part in the second CAS Day of the academic year on Thursday, and I hope they all have a fabulous time. We will welcome Year 7 parents and carers to their first Parents' Evening on Wednesday, and we have asked students to bring along their exercise books in order to inform discussions with their class teachers. There will be a cake sale from 4pm-5pm held on the Astroturf for Parents/Carers to enjoy a sweet treat during parents evening. The money raised will be put back into the PE department for the Netball Girls to purchase new kit. On behalf of the Netball Girls and myself, thank you for any and all contributions!

Reporting your child's absence

When reporting your child's absence from school on the dedicated absence line, please ensure you provide their name, year and registration group, reason for absence and your details, please ensure you spell out your child's name to ensure they are marked correctly.

Valuables in school

The school policy and guidance with regard to pupil possessions is clear that they are brought into school at their own risk. The Hollyfield School does not accept liability for any items that may be lost, damaged or stolen. While theft is taken extremely seriously and thoroughly investigated, the school is not in a position to cover the cost of any item stolen.

Of course, with respect to the last point, steps and measures are put in place to mitigate against such circumstances, especially during PE and Games lessons, where pupils' items are locked in the changing rooms. While this is standard procedure, there may be some extenuating circumstances where this cannot always be guaranteed. Therefore, I would urge your son/daughter not to bring expensive items into school.

Medical Health Care Plans

Please can we remind all parents to complete a MHCP for any student with a medical condition if you have not already done so. Also, if there are any changes to a current plan please complete and submit a new MHCP so we can update our records. You can <u>print a form</u> and return it to school.

Changed your address/email/phone number????

If you have changed your contact details, please email the school office on office@hollyfield.kingston.sch.uk stating your child's name and form and the change of details. It is important to keep these details up to date in case of an emergency. Don't forget to update your Parentmail account with your new details.

Water Bottles

Please ensure your child brings a water bottle with them to school every day, it is even more important during hot weather. Our water fountains can be used to refill bottles as necessary during break and lunch, it is not possible to drink from the fountains direct and we do not have bottles or cups to give out to students. Alternatively, bottles of water can be purchased (and refilled) in the cafeteria, please ensure your Parentmail account has enough funds to enable this.

Surbiton Hill Road Entrance for cars

If you drive/collect students to or from school the visitor's car park/Surbiton Hill Road entrance **should not be used to drop off students**. This causes congestion for people entering the site and staff access, cars travelling on Surbiton Hill Road and is potentially dangerous for pedestrians.

Dinner Money Top Up

Please ensure funds are available 24 hours before they are required when topping up your child's dinner money on Parentmail. If you add funds on the day they are to be used we will not be able to see the credit instantly until the system has processed it, therefore creating a delay in your child buying food at the canteen.



GETTINGTO KNOW THE.

English Department

Teaching English, in fact teaching in general, is a privilege. There is no other job which compares, challenges nor satisfies in the same way that teaching does.

Whilst I cannot deny the profession doesn't come without hardships, the gratification of "making a difference" to a child in our classroom outweighs all else. Knowing that you have helped a child feel better about themselves, helped them with an assessment, seen the moment that a concept or idea clicked is addictive and cannot be simulated in any other vocation.

Since joining Hollyfield in September 2014 as the Head of the English Faculty I have been fortunate to have worked alongside some of the most innovative and inspirational teachers I have ever met, and that is still true today! And here they are:

Acting Head of Faculty: Josephine Rhodes

I started teaching in September 2006 after dropping off an application at Grey Court serendipitously on my way out with some friends. Before I had even arrived I had received a telephone call inviting me in for an interview the following week! I was so excited! At this time Grey Court was a school that was classed as Required Improvement, but it didn't put me off and I have never looked back.

Over the last 19 (!) years I have continued to work up the career ladder working as an Opening Minds' Coordinator, EAL Lead, 2nd in charge and then a Head of Department at a school in Wimbledon, before I moved to the Head of Faculty role here at Hollyfield. Whilst teaching English still remains the best part of the job I now get to develop our links and relationships with local primary schools and work closely with the Year 7 pastoral team and developing the Y6 primary transition process.

2nd in Charge: Vicki Callaghan

My teaching vocation began 15 years ago at Grey Court School where I was mentored by none other than current Head of Faculty Josephine Rhodes! Over the course of my career I have held positions including KS3 Coordinator, Head of Year 9, Teacher in charge of Intervention and now, 2nd in charge of English. My favourite place to be is in the classroom, engaging with the students and sharing a love of learning.

I have been at Hollyfield School for 6 years and have enjoyed getting to know students from Year 7 all the way up to Year 13. Teaching English at Hollyfield is a privilege and a daily reminder that teaching is the only job I'd want to do!

Y8 + 9 Lead: Charlotte Lovell

I began teaching English in 2008 at Tolworth Girls School where I spent three years honing my skills in the classroom. In August 2011, wanting to explore the world outside my bubble, I applied for a teaching job in the UAE; this was the best decision of my career to date as I was able to live and teach in a foreign culture, work with inspiring teachers from all over the world and learn about myself as a person. My teaching 'travel bug' didn't end there as I then worked in an international school in Hong Kong for two years before finally moving back to the UK and joining Hollyfield in 2019. I love working in a school which is so vibrant and offers such a range of learning and teaching opportunities for both students and teachers. Every day is a delight.

English Teacher and Head of Year 13: Ben Hamilton

Before becoming a teacher, I worked as a Freelance Journalist for several years, writing and making graphics about climate change and conservation. Since training to become a teacher six years ago, I have been driven by a hope that I can make a change and difference. I have been Key Stage 4 coordinator, Second in Charge of English, and now Head of Year 13, helping guide our oldest students into their adult lives and future careers.

I love working at Hollyfield with such talented and driven teachers who care so much about the young people in their lessons and corridors, and working here has helped confirm that teaching is one of the greatest jobs there is.

English Teacher and Head of Year 8: Sofi Jenkins

I have been teaching for 5 years. After getting back from a gap year around Europe I returned to Australia and completed a Masters in Teaching. Once finished I returned to the UK from Australia to be with my partner and challenge myself living overseas (there was a lot of homesickness).

I have been at Hollyfield for 4 years and thoroughly enjoy growing my skill set. I have transitioned from English teacher to now Head of Year 8. 
