Our Site

The school site can be described as a leafy campus made up of several separate buildings. The main building, Albury, was a stately home until it opened as a coeducational school in 1937. New buildings have since been developed as the school has grown. There are four shaded grass or astroturf areas and an enormous dome students love to socialise under all year round.



Location

Surbiton is a wonderful place to live and work. The river Thames is a short walk away, you can follow it all the way into Kingston Upon Thames where you will find a buzzing metropolis of restaurants, bars and shops.

Surbiton station is on the mainline to London Waterloo station. The fast train is just 20 minutes. The school is situated 5 minutes walk from Surbiton station at the top of St Mark's Hill.

Renting in Surbiton and the surrounding area offers a convenient way to live nearby. There are also a range of government schemes that make purchasing a home accessible to first time buyers.

The high street is typical of a busy town in greater London. Surbiton also benefits from a number of excellent restaurants, bars and cafés on Maple Road.

Academic performance

Key Stage 4

We are incredibly proud of our students' results and the increase in our Progress 8 score over the previous three years. Last year, the school received a Progress 8 score of 0.23+, which is one of the highest scores the school has ever received. We also dramatically improved our disadvantaged students' outcomes with a Progress 8 score of 0, the highest score since 2016. We had several remarks that have not been included within this data. Therefore, we anticipate this to be even better in March 2023.

In terms of our overall grades, 17% of Hollyfield's GCSE grades were 8 or 9 and 32% were grades 7 to 9. An impressive 78% of our Year 11s achieved five or more grades 4 to 9, with 73% achieving five or more grades 4 to 9 including English and Maths. 60% of BTEC students achieved Distinction* to Merit.





Key Stage 5

Hollyfield has superb subject specialists and this is why we are one of the best performing Sixth Forms in Kingston over the last few years. Many of our subjects consistently achieve results that are ranked in the top 10% of all schools in the country. In 2022 our KS5 results were significantly better than our last set of ratified results, with 26% of students receiving A or A*, 50% A or B, 69% A to C and 97% A to E. Two of our students secured a place at Oxbridge universities with over 75% going to their first-choice universities.

As a school, we are delighted with our results. However, we aim to improve further so that we can continue to consistently perform as one of the best sixth forms in Kingston and Richmond.

Professional Development

Supporting you to achieve success throughout your career.

At The Hollyfield School, we will support your professional development, at whatever stage you are in your career. We are members of The Wandle Teaching School Hub, with links to UCL, and we have an active membership of The National College. Additionally, we provide support and training for Early Career Teachers, in line with the ECF - and we work with local universities to support graduate trainees (which, in itself, provides great opportunities for our subject specialists to train and mentor the next generation of teachers).

We keep our fingers on the pulse of our colleagues' training needs - and we build bespoke sessions into our twilight sessions, INSET Days and early morning 'Teach Eats'. We collaborate with our 'sister schools' in the Every Child, Every Day Academy Trust, and we build in cross-school moderation, curriculum planning and training activities. We send our colleagues on really impactful external CPD and we invite inspiring guest speakers to whole staff sessions. In addition, we sponsor colleagues as they complete nationally recognised qualifications, such as the NPQML, NPQSL and NPQHT.

Our sixth form

Teaching at Hollyfield Sixth Form is a rewarding experience for our staff. Our sixth formers are diverse, welcoming and inquisitive.

Hollyfield has been one of the best performing sixth forms in Kingston over the last few years. Many of our subjects consistently achieve results that are ranked in the top 10% of all schools in the country. Every year students get into the top universities from Oxford and Cambridge to Imperial and Kings and around 40% of our students go to Russell Group universities. There is a wide range of exciting extra-curricular activities where staff can contribute to the wider sixth form community. We run trips to New York and Washington, Paris, ski trips and a science trip to Cern. There is enrichment every Wednesday afternoon where we have a range of guest speakers, debates, political hustings, competitions, sports including; football, rugby and netball clubs.

Hollyfest

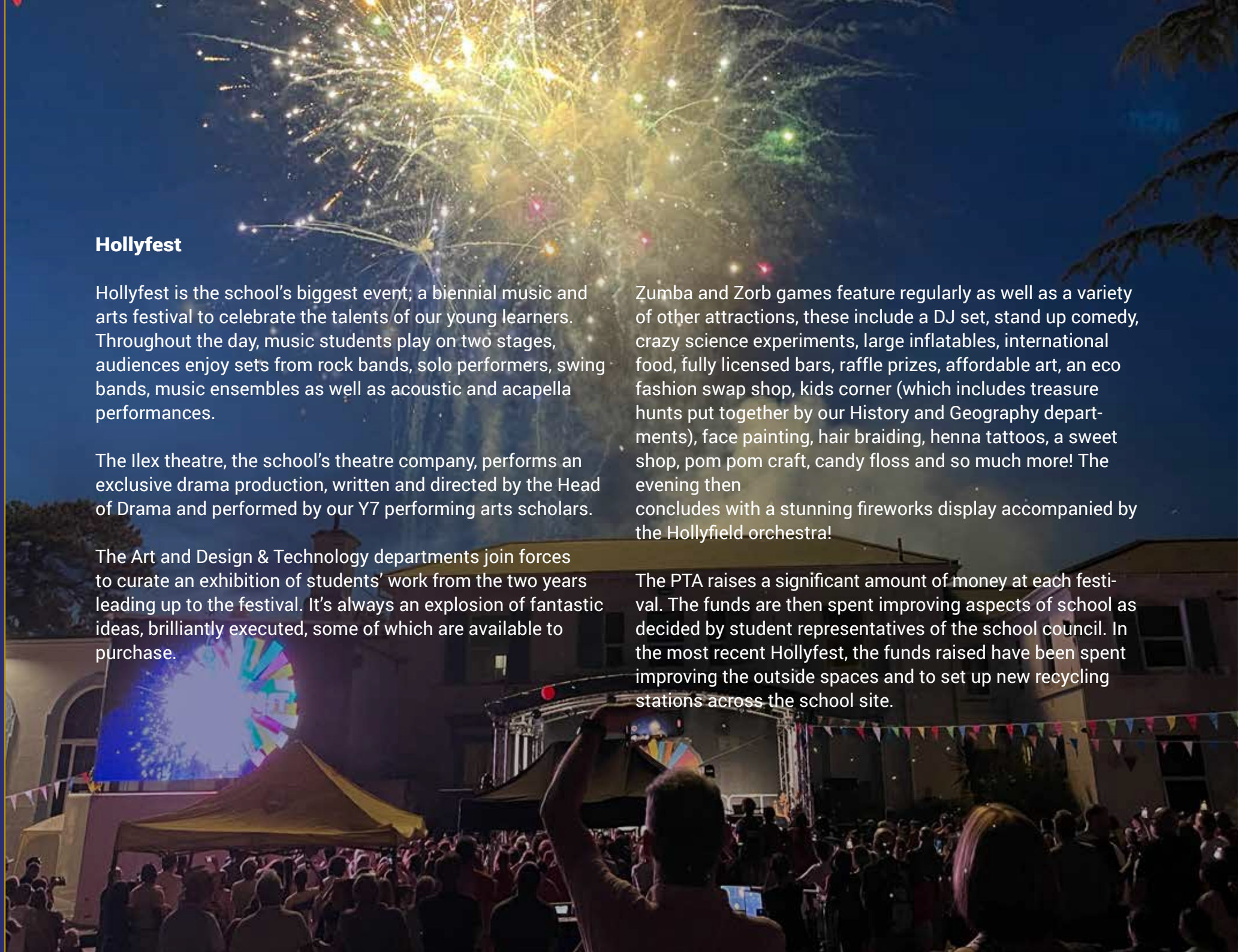
Hollyfest is the school's biggest event; a biennial music and arts festival to celebrate the talents of our young learners. Throughout the day, music students play on two stages, audiences enjoy sets from rock bands, solo performers, swing bands, music ensembles as well as acoustic and acapella performances.

The Ilex theatre, the school's theatre company, performs an exclusive drama production, written and directed by the Head of Drama and performed by our Y7 performing arts scholars.

The Art and Design & Technology departments join forces to curate an exhibition of students' work from the two years leading up to the festival. It's always an explosion of fantastic ideas, brilliantly executed, some of which are available to purchase.

Zumba and Zorb games feature regularly as well as a variety of other attractions, these include a DJ set, stand up comedy, crazy science experiments, large inflatables, international food, fully licensed bars, raffle prizes, affordable art, an eco fashion swap shop, kids corner (which includes treasure hunts put together by our History and Geography departments), face painting, hair braiding, henna tattoos, a sweet shop, pom pom craft, candy floss and so much more! The evening then concludes with a stunning fireworks display accompanied by the Hollyfield orchestra!

The PTA raises a significant amount of money at each festival. The funds are then spent improving aspects of school as decided by student representatives of the school council.
