Head's Line:

Dear Hollyfield Community

As Ms Jackson has been out this week, I have the pleasure of writing the ebulletin for parents and carers.

Year 11 - Welcome back to the Summer term. As I write this, most of our Year 11 students are finishing their final exams. I am incredibly proud of their achievements over the past 5 years. They have worked tirelessly in recent months to become our most successful students ever. This is a significant and sometimes overwhelming event in their lives, so please take the time to discuss it with them and offer support. If you are a Year 11 parent and need assistance, please feel free to get in touch. I wish them all the best and hope they enjoy their long summer break.

Passport - I would also like to express my gratitude to all the Year 11 parents/carers who supported our passport process. I understand that it has been challenging for some students, but the majority of feedback has been extremely positive. We recognise that students perform better in school, where they receive crucial support and guidance from our teaching staff, rather than studying at home. I welcome parental feedback on this aspect of your child's education, so please don't hesitate to email me directly with your comments and thoughts (mwinpenny@hollyfield.kingston.sch.uk).

Year 8 to 10 exams - As Year 11 students leave, we shift our focus to the other year groups. Students in Years 8 to 10 are currently taking their end-of-year exams. As part of this process, we conduct some of the exams in the same spaces where students will sit their actual GCSEs. This helps reduce the barriers and anxiety associated with exams. The feedback from staff and invigilators regarding student behaviour and effort during the exams so far has been overwhelmingly positive. During the weekend, please discuss your child's revision and check in with them. If they are feeling stressed or anxious about any aspect of the examination process, please contact the school directly.

Year 7 PGL Trip - This weekend, Year 7 students are going on their PGL trip. One of the students informed me that PGL stands for "parents get lost," which was something I had never heard before :) If your child is attending, I hope they have an amazing time.

Water bottles/sunscreen - This week has been extremely hot, and it appears that the hot weather will continue into next week. Please ensure that your child brings a water bottle to school and that they apply sunscreen if they are participating in outdoor activities.

Centralised detentions - Starting from Monday, the school will implement its new centralised detention system. As part of this change, we will reintroduce PM registration, which will take place from 14:50 to 15:05. If a student has a detention, their form tutor will accompany them to the designated rooms. By tightening our system, we aim to facilitate more restorative and reparative conversations between students and teachers, thereby improving behaviour within and around the school premises. It is crucial for parents to have access to the Classcharts application so they can review their child's behaviour record. If you do not have access, please email Mr. Bonehill (dbonehill@hollyfield.kingston.sch.uk). I hope that all parents will support us with this change.

Reporting your child's absence

When reporting your child's absence from school on the dedicated absence line, please ensure you provide their name, year and registration group, reason for absence and your details, please ensure you spell out your child's name to ensure they are marked correctly.

Valuables in school

The school policy and guidance with regard to pupil possessions is clear that they are brought into school at their own risk. The Hollyfield School does not accept liability for any items that may be lost, damaged or stolen. While theft is taken extremely seriously and thoroughly investigated, the school is not in a position to cover the cost of any item stolen.

Of course, with respect to the last point, steps and measures are put in place to mitigate against such circumstances, especially during PE and Games lessons, where pupils' items are locked in the changing rooms. While this is standard procedure, there may be some extenuating circumstances where this cannot always be guaranteed. Therefore, I would urge your son/daughter not to bring expensive items into school.

Medical Health Care Plans

Please can we remind all parents to complete a MHCP for any student with a medical condition if you have not already done so. Also, if there are any changes to a current plan please complete and submit a new MHCP so we can update our records. You can [print a form](#) and return it to school.

Changed your address/email/phone number????

If you have changed your contact details, please email the school office on office@hollyfield.kingston.sch.uk stating your child's name and form and the change of details. It is important to keep these details up to date in case of an emergency. Don't forget to update your Parentmail account with your new details.

Water Bottles

Please ensure your child brings a water bottle with them to school every day, it is even more important during hot weather. Our water fountains can be used to refill bottles as necessary during break and lunch, it is not possible to drink from the fountains direct and we do not have bottles or cups to give out to students. Alternatively, bottles of water can be purchased (and refilled) in the cafeteria, please ensure your Parentmail account has enough funds to enable this.

Surbiton Hill Road Entrance for cars

If you drive/collect students to or from school the visitor's car park/Surbiton Hill Road entrance **should not be used to drop off students**. This causes congestion for people entering the site and staff access, cars travelling on Surbiton Hill Road and is potentially dangerous for pedestrians.

Dinner Money Top Up

Please ensure funds are available 24 hours before they are required when topping up your child's dinner money on Parentmail. If you add funds on the day they are to be used we will not be able to see the credit instantly until the system has processed it, therefore creating a delay in your child buying food at the canteen.

Year 10 are being encouraged to use [Unifrog](#) to help them to find out about their choices at **post 16**. There will be a range of open events that schools/colleges have for students to go and look around and get a feel for the place and courses.

Hollyfield [Sixth Form](#) will have their open event in November and Mr Warren the Head of Sixth Form will be speaking to Year 10s this term and there will be subject taster sessions in the Autumn term. Esher College has an open event on the 3rd July and most other sixth forms and colleges will have open events in the Autumn Term. Students can apply to as many Colleges/Sixth Forms as they like, we advise them to apply to at least two to keep options open and apply directly to each provider.


