Reporting your child's absence

When reporting your child's absence from school on the dedicated absence line - 0208 339 4518 preferably before 8.30am on the morning of your child's absence from school. Please leave their name, spelling out any unusual names, year group and the reason for their absence and your details. Alternatively, you can email the school office@hollyfield.kingston.sch.uk.

Valuables in school

The school policy and guidance with regard to pupil possessions is clear that they are brought into school at their own risk. The Hollyfield School does not accept liability for any items that may be lost, damaged or stolen. While theft is taken extremely seriously and thoroughly investigated, the school is not in a position to cover the cost of any item stolen.

Of course, with respect to the last point, steps and measures are put in place to mitigate against such circumstances, especially during PE and Games lessons, where pupils' items are locked in the changing rooms. While this is standard procedure, there may be some extenuating circumstances where this cannot always be guaranteed. Therefore, I would urge your son/daughter not to bring expensive items into school.

Medical Health Care Plans

Please can we remind all parents to complete a MHCP for any student with a medical condition if you have not already done so. Also, if there are any changes to a current plan please complete and submit a new MHCP so we can update our records. You can print a form and return it to school.

Changed your address/email/phone number????

If you have changed your contact details, please email the school office on office@hollyfield.kingston.sch.uk stating your child's name and form and the change of details. It is important to keep these details up to date in case of an emergency. Don't forget to update your Parentmail account with your new details.

Water Bottles

Please ensure your child brings a water bottle with them to school every day, it is even more important during hot weather. Our water fountains can be used to refill bottles as necessary during break and lunch, it is not possible to drink from the fountains direct and we do not have bottles or cups to give out to students. Alternatively, bottles of water can be purchased (and refilled) in the cafeteria, please ensure your Parentmail account has enough funds to enable this.

Surbiton Hill Road Entrance for cars

If you drive/collect students to or from school the visitor's car park/Surbiton Hill Road entrance **should not be used to drop off students**. This causes congestion for people entering the site and staff access, cars travelling on Surbiton Hill Road and is potentially dangerous for pedestrians.

Dinner Money Top Up

Please ensure funds are available 24 hours before they are required when topping up your child's dinner money on Parentmail. If you add funds on the day they are to be used we will not be able to see the credit instantly until the system has processed it, therefore creating a delay in your child buying food at the canteen.



Careers Briefing - 26 April 2024 Mr Poole & Miss Corrighan (Careers team)

Year 11 - All Year 11s should by now have a plan about where they want to study next year or whether they are going into an apprenticeship. Many students are staying on in the Sixth Form but others have places at other local Sixth Forms and colleges such as NESCOT and Kingston. If students do not have any applications for college and need some support they should see Mr Poole or Miss Corrighan who can help them apply for colleges and apprenticeships. You can start an apprenticeship at various stages but students who leave at 16 could apply to do a Level 2 apprenticeship. A good place to find local vacancies is on: Find an apprenticeship - GOV.UK



Year 10

We are organising an aspirational visit to **Sussex University on 2 July**. This trip is an important part of the careers provision as this visit is an opportunity to visit a successful campus based university and gain an insight into higher education. Even if students do not want to go to university it is recommended that they attend to find out

more about future options so they can make informed choices.

When the students arrive at Sussex University they will be greeted by student ambassadors and they will have an interactive session on why people go to university. There will also be an opportunity to meet a number of student ambassadors and also have a tour of the extensive university campus.

What roles are available?


Artists & Illustrators: they may work through a variety of mediums such as painting, sculpting and digital. They sometimes create pieces in-house for an organisation, or get commissioned on a freelance basis.

Designers: such as <u>Product Designers</u>, <u>Interior Designers</u> and <u>Fashion Designers</u>. You could also specialise in a specific craft such as <u>Glass Designers</u>.

Tech-based: these include <u>Animators</u> who make moving creatives for television & video games, as well as <u>Graphic Designers</u> who create digital art for creatives such as adverts. In the online space, there are also roles such as <u>Web Designers</u> and <u>Social Media Managers</u>.

Art Historians: such as <u>Art Administrators</u> who are involved in the management of a cultural organisation, <u>Buyers</u> & Collectors, and <u>Gallery & Museum Curators</u>.

What skills do I need?



Problem-solving: You can creatively construct a product or piece that's the right fit for its audience.

Uni or Apprenticeship?
