Head’s Line:

Dear Hollyfield Community

I hope you are all well. We have had another great (and very busy) week at Hollyfield. Our Year 11 and 13 students have begun their public exams in earnest and we’ve all been really impressed with their attitude and commitment. Year 11 students have been taking part in specially designed 'passport' revision sessions ahead of each exam, with each student following a bespoke timetable to enable them to maximise their time at school. We have also introduced 6pm Google Meets in a number of subject areas, which take place the evening before an exam and which allow teachers to give some reassuring guidance, so that students feel supported and secure. Our English department also hosted a pre-exam breakfast session on Monday morning, which was very well attended. Huge thanks to all the teaching and support staff who are going the extra mile to support our students - and very well done, so far, to all those taking the exam season in their stride. We are already very proud of you.

This week, we also met the newest members of our school community. On two evenings this week, members of the leadership and pastoral team met with next year's Year 7 students, along with their parents and carers, for one-to-one interviews. The evenings are a great chance for us to get to know the students and to help ease their transition from primary school. They also give students and parents an opportunity to share information, questions and concerns. It was great to see so many smiling faces - and we are looking forward to meeting the students again on July 3, for their transition day.

The book giveaway took place today in the library and was another resounding success!! The children thoroughly enjoyed searching the tables for a title that peaked their interest. Some left with just the one title and others were taking a few, all of which was wonderful to see.

Next week, there are a couple of calendar dates to bring to your attention: A reminder that on Wednesday 22 May at 6.45pm, we will hold an information meeting for parents and carers around the upcoming PGL trip. That evening is also the second of our Performing Arts Scholars' theatre trips: Year 7s attended *Operation Mincemeat* this week and thoroughly enjoyed themselves. Next week, Y9 students will visit *Hadestown*, which is a critically acclaimed and much raved about production. Thanks to Miss Neville for organising both excursions.

Lastly, but by no means least, on Friday 24 May is the Record of Achievement ceremony for Year 11. This is always a real highlight of the academic year, where students, teachers, parents and carers gather on the lawn outside Albury to celebrate the hard work and achievements of our students and to wish them well. Mr Buckman (who always does an excellent job of organising the event) will communicate directly with parents over the next few days, but I wanted to flag up the early closure for students in Years 7-10. They will attend lessons as usual p1-3 and will go to their tutor groups at 11.40 for a phased dismissal, leaving the site at or just before mid-day.

### **Reporting your child's absence**

When reporting your child's absence from school on the dedicated absence line - 0208 339 4518 preferably before 8.30am on the morning of your child's absence from school. ### **Valuables in school**

The school policy and guidance with regard to pupil possessions is clear that they are brought into school at their own risk. The Hollyfield School does not accept liability for any items that may be lost, damaged or stolen. While theft is taken extremely seriously and thoroughly investigated, the school is not in a position to cover the cost of any item stolen.

Of course, with respect to the last point, steps and measures are put in place to mitigate against such circumstances, especially during PE and Games lessons, where pupils' items are locked in the changing rooms. While this is standard procedure, there may be some extenuating circumstances where this cannot always be guaranteed. Therefore, I would urge your son/daughter not to bring expensive items into school.

### **Medical Health Care Plans**

Please can we remind all parents to complete a MHCP for any student with a medical condition if you have not already done so. Also, if there are any changes to a current plan please complete and submit a new MHCP so we can update our records. You can [print a form](#) and return it to school.

### **Changed your address/email/phone number????**

If you have changed your contact details, please email the school office on [office@hollyfield.kingston.sch.uk](mailto:office@hollyfield.kingston.sch.uk) stating your child's name and form and the change of details. It is important to keep these details up to date in case of an emergency. Don't forget to update your Parentmail account with your new details.

### **Water Bottles**

Please ensure your child brings a water bottle with them to school every day, it is even more important during hot weather. Our water fountains can be used to refill bottles as necessary during break and lunch, it is not possible to drink from the fountains direct and we do not have bottles or cups to give out to students. Alternatively, bottles of water can be purchased (and refilled) in the cafeteria, please ensure your Parentmail account has enough funds to enable this.

### **Surbiton Hill Road Entrance for cars**

If you drive/collect students to or from school the visitor's car park/Surbiton Hill Road entrance **should not be used to drop off students**. This causes congestion for people entering the site and staff access, cars travelling on Surbiton Hill Road and is potentially dangerous for pedestrians.

### **Dinner Money Top Up**

Please ensure funds are available 24 hours before they are required when topping up your child's dinner money on Parentmail. If you add funds on the day they are to be used we will not be able to see the credit instantly until the system has processed it, therefore creating a delay in your child buying food at the canteen.

### Careers Briefing - 17 May 2024 Mr Poole & Miss Corrighan (Careers team)

#### Year 10

Mr. Poole and Miss Corrighan are beginning to interview students in Year 10. Students need to begin to think about their future destinations. Ideally all students should aim to gain a minimum 5 GCSEs at level 4 and above including English and Maths if they wish to progress on to an A Level, BTEC Level 3 or T Level courses. There are courses for students at college in Levels 1 & 2 so we encourage students to look at the range of options. Post 16 options in education [Hollyfield Sixth form](#) & colleges. **You can also do an apprenticeship at 16 or 18.**

There are some open events this term you can attend:

- [Nescot College](#) - offers a range of vocational courses including Animal Care, Construction, Media, Hair & Beauty and much more. **Open event: Wednesday 22 May, 2024 16:30 - 19:30**
- [Esher College](#) - **Open Evening on Monday 1 July 2024 4.30 – 8.00pm** This is the only open event for students starting in 2025. There are also tours that take place but look on their website for more information
- [Kingston College](#) Open event on 21st June 2024 11.00-14.00 - more open events in the Autumn Term in the evenings and on the weekends.

Applications - you will automatically be offered a place at Hollyfield sixth form. If you want to apply to Esher College applications open on July 2 otherwise most college applications should be made from late September and October onwards.

### Careers in Focus - The Legal Profession



#### Different types of Lawyers

Many students say they are interested in being a lawyer after watching Drama programmes like Suits or Silk or various other legal based shows. However, Lawyer is a general term referring to anyone who is qualified to give legal advice as a licensed legal practitioner. This includes solicitors and barristers.

**Solicitors** give legal support, advice and services to clients, who can be individuals, private companies, public sector organisations or other groups. Working in private practice, in-house for commercial organisations, in local or central government or in the court service, they may specialise in certain areas of law such as property, family or finance. Whilst In England and Wales, **Barristers** represent individuals or organisations in court, carry out research into points of law and advise clients on their case. #### How do I get qualified?

There are no specific A Levels you need to apply to do a Law degree but having three good academic A levels with high grades is important to get into university to study a degree in Law (LLB). Normally A levels which require good analytical skills are considered important are subjects like English, Sociology, Philosophy, History, Economics and Mathematics. You can also do a non-law degree and then do a 1 year Law conversion course,

To study Law full time, it will take about **five or six years** to qualify as a solicitor. This includes a three-year law degree at university; the SQE (Solicitors Qualifying Exam) and two-years of qualifying legal work experience. Studying a non-law subject for your degree means you'll need to factor in the time it takes to study for a law conversion course and/or an SQE preparation course, both of which can extend the training period. Becoming a fully-fledged barrister takes **five years** - including three years for your law degree, one year for a Bar course and a one-year pupillage in chambers. Again, add an extra year for a law conversion course if your degree wasn't in law.

### Legal apprenticeships

There are also several routes into Law via apprenticeships schemes. Law apprenticeships are divided into three broad levels: legal administration/support, **paralegal** or **solicitor**. There is also a specialist pathway to qualify as a **chartered legal executive**. Find out more: [Law apprenticeships | Prospects.ac.uk](#)

### How much are trainee lawyers paid?

The Law Society recommends a minimum trainee salary of £23,703 in London and £21,024 out of London. In reality, trainee lawyer salaries vary across the UK. Firms in London often pay trainees above and beyond the recommended minimum. For example, the Magic Circle - composed of Allen & Overy, Clifford Chance, Freshfield Bruckhaus Deringer, Linklaters and Slaughter and May - London's five most prestigious law firms currently offer first year trainees salaries of £50,000. 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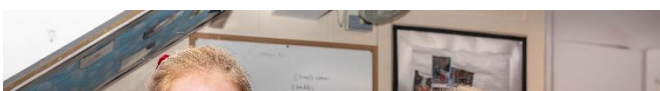
